

Qualtrics Survey Accessibility Checklist

1. Choosing Qualtrics Layouts and Question Types

Enable the Qualtrics [New Survey Taking Experience \(NSTE\)](#) before building a survey. Old layouts only guarantee to be compliant with WCAG 2.0

- [Become familiar with question types and features that are currently compatible with NSTE.](#)
- [Become familiar with these unsupported/discontinued features in NSTE and alternatives.](#)
- [Become familiar with currently unsupported features in NSTE.](#)
- Use the default “simple layout.” See **Survey tab, Look & Feel** menu, change the layout to **"Simple"**.

2. Survey Name and Description

- [Update your survey's display name](#) - set under **survey options** menu to something descriptive of your survey.
- [Update your survey's description](#) – set under **survey options** menu to something descriptive of your survey.

3. Survey Navigation

- Use [section headings](#) to organize survey content within survey pages and within large blocks of text (e.g., instructions, consent forms). **Note that each question should be a heading level.** You can find section headings in a [Qualtrics question's Rich Content Editor](#).
- Be descriptive about where a respondent is within the survey:
 - Enable automatic question numbers in **Survey Options** and **Question Numbers**
 - Show how many questions are in each part of the survey
- [Update survey button text](#) to ensure survey navigation buttons have text descriptions such as **Back (or Previous)** and **Next**.
- Ensure **Autoadvance on Questions** is not enabled and **Page transition** set to **None** under **Motions** tab.

4. Accessible Text Formatting

- Use a san serif font like Arial or Verdana.
- Avoid using all caps for emphasizing information.
- Avoid underlining text unless it's a link.

5. Accessible Links

- Ensure that hyperllnk text is descriptive of the link location. No “click here”, “more information” or long URL addresses as text.

6. Accessible Colors

- Text and background (or images with text) must have sufficient contrast.
 - o 4.5:1 contrast ratio for regular text (less than 18pt/24px or less than 14pt/18.5px bold).
 - o 3:1 contrast ratio for large text (18pt/24px or 14pt/18.5px bold or greater).

7. Accessible Tables

- If adding a data table, use Qualtrics’ built in Table option within the [Rich Content editor](#) and under **Table Properties** menu, specify **Headers**.

8. Accessible Lists

- When creating bulleted or numbered lists, always [use the bulleted list or numbered list option within Qualtrics’ Rich Content Editor](#).

9. Accessible Images

- When [inserting images into your Qualtrics survey](#), add descriptive alternative text to your survey image under the **image properties** menu. Keep alternative text to 150 character or around 30 words.
- Complex images like charts and graphs may require a longer description than what was mentioned above. Options:
 - o Include descriptive text surrounding the image (such as data table).
 - o Include a link to a separate page with a longer description.

10. Accessible Form Fields

- Certain field types require enabling Autocomplete.)[Autocomplete in Qualtrics, what are autocomplete values?](#))

11. Accessible Video and Audio

- When inserting video or audio through [Qualtrics’ insert media feature](#), or through an embed codes, videos should include captions or audio includes transcripts.

12. Using reCAPTCHA

- If reCAPTCHA is needed, instead of using a [Qualtrics reCAPTCHA verification question](#), [enable reCAPTCHA within your Survey Options menu](#).

Check Survey Accessibility Tool

To check accessibility: **Survey – Tools – Check Survey Accessibility**

Note that the [Accessibility checker](#) is a helpful tool to check for incompatible questions types, missing alt text, etc. but not every accessibility issue. Following this checklist is the key to accessibility compliance.
