

Creating a Digital Accessibility Roadmap & Plan







What is a Digital Accessibility Roadmap?

The organization-wide roadmap outlines an 11-step timeline for how to get your organization compliant with:

- ► Federal 2024 Department of Justice (DOJ) Title II update by the April 2026 or 2027 deadline
- The state's web accessibility law and standard (for state government)

11-Step Roadmap

Step 1: Learn about the current and new requirements for web accessibility

Step 2: Identify a designated Agency Digital Accessibility Coordinator

Step 3: Ensure training completion by Digital Accessibility Coordinator

Step 4: Conduct an audit of major web properties (audit spreadsheet)

11-Step Roadmap

Step 5: Familiarize yourself with the Title II update exceptions

Step 6: Test your current content for accessibility (inventory spreadsheet)

Step 7: Develop an action plan summary for each Website/Web Application

Step 8: Work through your action plan (remediate content not identified in exceptions)

11-Step Roadmap

Step 9: Develop a status report

Step 10: Submit your agency's Web Accessibility Plan

Step 11: Maintain the accessibility of your content

What is a Digital Accessibility Plan?

- ► The plan outlines how you will integrate and maintain ongoing accessibility within your organization
- "The tools that make up your accessibility toolkit"
- ► Step 10 in Roadmap references this document
- ▶ Depending upon organization size, you may have one plan or multiple plans (by Division, by Agency, etc.)

Digital Accessibility Plan Includes:

- Digital Accessibility Law, Standard and Guidelines
- Accessibility Principles
- Digital Accessibility Statement
- ▶ Digital Accessibility Issue Resolution process

Digital Accessibility Plan Includes

- Procurement of Accessible Digital Services
- Accessibility Exclusions
- Staff Roles and Responsibilities
- ▶ Role-Based Training Plan

Digital Accessibility Plan Includes

- ► Testing Tools and Techniques
- Document/PDF Procedures & Guidelines
- Webpage Content Procedures & Guidelines

Accessibility Plan

Communications, Legal, Human Resources and/or Information Technology
